

PROTECTION FEATURES OF GATE-TO-SOURCE ZENER DIODES

The built-in back-to-back Zener diodes have specifically been designed to enhance not only the device's ESD capability, but also to make them safely absorb possible voltage transients that may occasionally be applied from gate to source. In this respect the Zener voltage is appropriate to achieve an efficient and cost-effective intervention to protect the device's integrity. These integrated Zener diodes thus avoid the usage of external components.

Figure 3: Safe Operating Area




Figure 4: Output Characteristics




Figure 5: Transconductance




Figure 6: Thermal Impedance




Figure 7: Transfer Characteristics




Figure 8: Static Drain-source On Resistance




Figure 9: Gate Charge vs Gate-source Voltage




Figure 10: Normalized Gate Threshold Voltage vs Temperature




Figure 11: Source-Drain Diode Forward Characteristics




Figure 12: Capacitance Variations




Figure 13: Normalized On Resistance vs Temperature





Figure 14: Normalized BVdss vs Temperature

Figure 15: Avalanche Energy vs Starting T_j




Figure 16: Unclamped Inductive Load Test Circuit




Figure 19: Unclamped Inductive Waveform




Figure 17: Switching Times Test Circuit For Resistive Load




Figure 20: Gate Charge Test Circuit





Figure 18: Test Circuit For Inductive Load Switching and Diode Recovery Times


